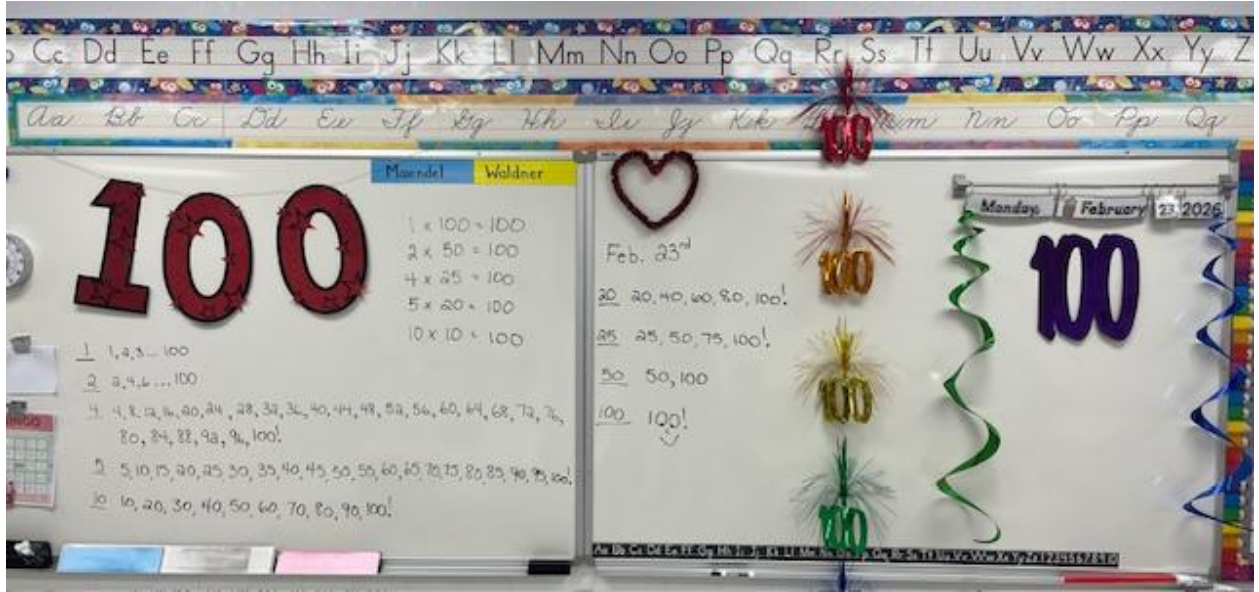
SCIENCE
