## **Mrs. Evenson's News**

Another colder January this year meant for a few more snow days then we anticipated. Students have done a great job in keeping up with the condensed days, and continuing to grow as learners. With January in the rearview mirror, it makes room for February, in which we will be celebrating **100 DAYS OF SCHOOL** on February 23rd! Like last year, Early Years students are invited to bring 100 pieces of a food item to add to our “salad” we will share with each other on that day.

In ELA, K-3 students continued to build on their reading and writing skills through the study of Fairy Tales (Gr. 1-2s) and Ocean Animals (Gr 3s). We are further building our understanding by using story telling to learn about Canada’s North – especially life in Nunavut. By integrating Social Studies and Art, students are able to make connections between themselves and the world around them easier. Be sure to check out the art samples during Progress Conversations.

In Math, we continued to focus on building our math understanding. Kindergartens are becoming comfortable with numbers 1-10, as we begin to look at exploring numbers 11-20. In Grade 1-2 we have been working on word problems using 2 digits to 1 digit in both addition and subtraction. Grade 3s have been working on becoming multiplication masters, focusing on 2, 3, 4, 5 and 10 times table to groups of 12. Grade 3s are encouraged to use their flash cards at home to become comfortable to recalling these facts quickly.

## **Mrs. Khubbar's News**

Our days are filled with steady learning and many small moments of growth as students continue to explore new ideas together. In Math, Grade 4 students are moving from decimals into multiplication, Grade 6 from integers and ratios into patterns, Grade 7 from probability (ratios, fractions, and percents) into addition and subtraction of integers, and Grade 9 students will continue strengthening their skills while working on polynomials. In ELA, Grades 4, 6, and 7 have been developing their ideas through narrative writing and will now move into descriptive writing, while Grade 9 students are putting the finishing touches on their zine projects. In Social Studies, Grades 6, 7, and 9 have begun exploring Ancient Greece and will continue learning about its history, culture, and daily life.
